Long, long ago...

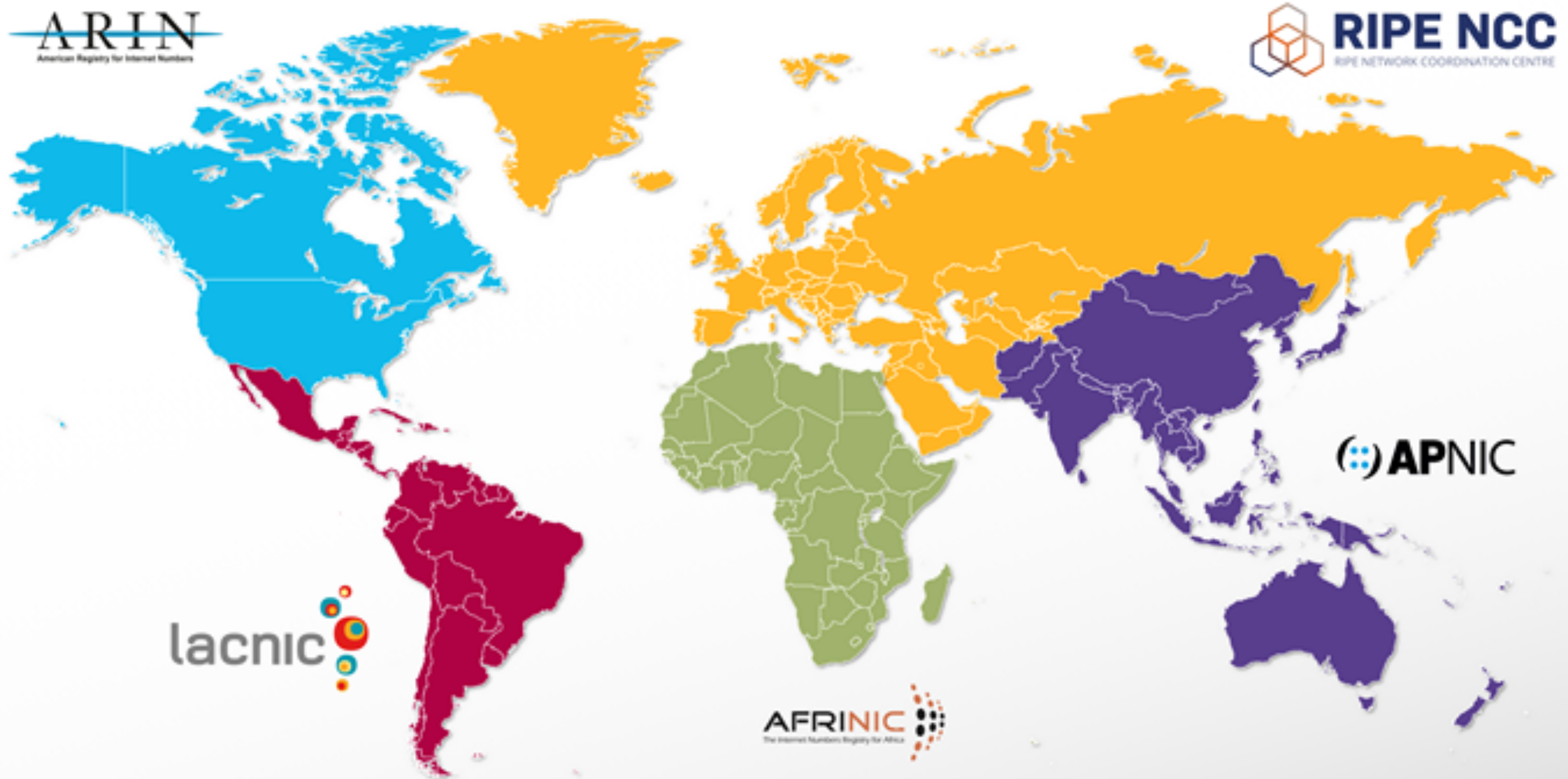


The beginning

Long, long ago, in 1989

- In 1989 the people building the early Internet began meeting to coordinate with each other
 - "The European IP Networks", in French: "Réseaux IP Européens", RIPE for short
 - Collectively called "the RIPE community"
- In 1992 they started a coordination center to be the secretariat for the community
 - The RIPE Network Coordination Center, RIPE NCC
 - Initially didn't distribute IP addresses, that came a bit later!
